PRESIDENT'S RUN 2023 - OVERVIEW

The "Presidents Run" has accommodation confirmed for Friday 16th to Sunday 18th June. As per last months "Accelerations".

Departure point for the adventure will be Workers' Sports Club lower car park Oliver Av Goonellabah at 8:45am, Friday 16/6/23.

The route for Day 1 will be Bruxner Hwy and M1 with suitable pick up points near Alstonville, Ballina and Murwillumbah.

The first "pit stop" will be Yatala Pies, Yatala for morning tea. Ample parking is available with good exit & re-entry to M1.

We then move on via the M1 & Gateway Bridge (toll road) to the yet to be opened BRISBANE MOTOR MUSEUM, Banyo, Brisbane (entry fee). There are about 30 carparks under the museum with other parking adjacent. There is also a café on site for lunch or a snack. We then head to our accommodation at Clear Mountain Lodge, Clear Mountain. There is limited parking at reception so it may be necessary to wait in the general carpark before moving up. There are lots of trees and bird life so bring a car cover if you have one. Pre-dinner drinks will be on the deck (weather permitting) adjacent to the restaurant.

Day 2

Depart Clear Mountain driving north through Dayboro and Woodford to arrive at Mountain View Café, Mountain View Rd, Maleny for lunch. We will then have a stop in Maleny to stroll for a while and walk off lunch. After leaving Maleny we travel the Blackall Range tourist drive passing through Kenilworth, Mapleton and Flaxton to arrive at our accommodation in Montville. Accommodation is at Montville Mountain Inn (motel). Pre-dinner drinks are on the back deck of our rooms and dinner is next door at Montville Café, Bar & Grill.

Day 3

Breakfast is at The Edge Café, about 100 metres' up the road from the motel. We then drive along the scenic route through Landsborough on to Qld Air Museum (entry fee) at Caloundra. DAVID GORDONS TOYOTA CELICA STORY

In around 1984, I bought a 1971 yellow Toyota Celica coupe in very poor condition, with plans to restore it.

I stripped the whole car and sold the original 1600cc engine and gearbox from the car, which meant the car cost me nothing.

I proceeded to cut all the rust out of the car, replaced all of the rusty panels with new

ones and replaced all the door seal rubbers, upholstery and door cards. I seam welded the roof and sills, and then repainted the whole car.



The first engine I fitted was a 3SGTEU factory turbo charged 1800cc Toyota engine, fitted to a 5 speed Supra gearbox, running 22lb boost. I also fitted a Toyota Sprinter rear end, meaning that the vehicle had 4 wheel disc brakes with larger rotors. I fitted Nissan 240Z alloy wheels of the same vintage.

The car was wickedly fast.



I later decided to fit a Toyota 1GG super charged 6 cylinder twin cam engine to the car, running a small pulley on the super charger.



The car had incredible acceleration, and still made good horsepower on the Dyno at 8,500 revs. It had a top speed close to 250 kms per hour, going by the rev counter, as the odometer needle had gone right around the dial and came back to the stop pin!

One unfortunate incident occurred whilst taking a friend who owned a Corvette for a run, when the passenger seat snapped under acceleration as the mechanism could not handle the G force and he

ended up laying flat on his back with his head on the rear seat.

The 1GG engine was a fantastic engine and suited the car brilliantly. When I got it engineered, the engineer was very impressed with the cars performance and handling. Whilst he was completing the paperwork, his son arrived home from school and he asked me to take his son for a ride so that his son could experience the cars performance.

Due to some kind of madness, I was in search of more horsepower. I decided to fit a Toyota 2JZ 3 litre engine fitted with a Garrett turbo charger running a water to air intercooler which I hand fabricated with secondary radiators under both front mudguards.

On the Dyno at half boost, the car was making just under 250 horsepower at the rear wheels at 7lb boost, which was twice the horsepower of a friends 5 litre Ford V8 on the same Dyno. We could not run more boost on the Dyno as there was not sufficient room to run wider rubber on the rear wheels. I ran 13.5 boost on the road, resulting in wheel spin at 160 kms per hour in dry weather. The car was lethal in the wet.



I made a big mistake by fitting the 2JZ in such a light car. The car only weighed 1060kgs on the weighbridge when I got the car engineered. The engine overpowered the car way too much which upset the handling characteristics of the car. I should have stuck with the 1GG engine as it was only 2 litre and much lighter.

I finished up selling the car as I only had 1 point left on my licence, something to do with a very touchy throttle.

I still have many regrets; the biggest one being not sticking with the 2 litre supercharged engine, as it was light and suited the car so well, and had more than enough power.

I also regret selling it and wish I still owned it. The car now lives in Newcastle as far as I know, and still has the 2JZ engine.
