

## SAT NOV 18th AMUSU THEATRE CENTENARY

Venue for traditional Club and Central Tablelands Car Club gatherings over many years, Amusu Theatre celebrated a century since its founder, Allan Tom, commenced a travelling movie show in the central west of NSW.

As a young man, he took to the road and screened movies in marquees and halls in all kinds of weather to provide entertainment to communities in the Central West of NSW.

In 1929, with the advent of talking movies, he became concerned about the acoustics of the Memorial Hall, feeling it was too "echoie", so he acquired land, and concerned about good sound, imported special material from America to line his new theatre.

The theatre building did not come until the 1936, and is now a remarkable tribute and museum to its founder and the Manildra community.

The Theatre has been operating continuously since its official opening in September 1936, and is now "owned" by the Manildra community.

The evening comprised a number of tributes to the Tom Family and community supporters who have kept this local icon in as close to its original state as practicable.

Many (maybe most) endeavoured to attend in period style.

Whilst the 1920's have been mostly portrayed as being the bootlegging and gangster eras of Chicago, it is more kindly remembered for the flamboyant style and flapper dressing of the ladies of the era, compared with the conservative double breasted suits with waistcoats, razor sharp creases, and felt hats of the men of the era.

Unfortunately (for me) transport to the centenary did not include a great number of Packards, Cadillacs and Pierce Arrows so frequently portrayed in 1920's movies.

However, pride of place did go to a 1928 Chev truck! (seen behind the flapper girls)





The evening commenced with a magnificent pre movie "snack" sponsored by some of Manildra's businesses.

Very few would have needed dinner after this "snack", and it is a tribute to the committee supporting Amusu that it is held in sufficiently high regard to acquire this level of support. The "snack" was accompanied by talented musicians and artist performing well and unobtrusively.

All was enjoyed in the area behind the Garage/Museum, which appears to be improved every time we make a visit there.



The "movie show" included some clips from years past; a commercial for Bushells tea from about 1929 (which would totally frustrate those used to the 20 second commercials shown on TV these days); and an excellent presentation of highlights from past occasions at Amusu. During the latter, it became a game of "spotto" to see if anybody you knew. or their vehicles, would suddenly materialise on the screen. Thankfully and enjoyably, there were many!

## CHRISTMAS LIGHTS TOURS

As in previous years, members are encouraged to show the public our range of wonderful vehicles by taking them on a tour of the Christmas Lights in Parkes and/or Forbes. Members are free to travel solo or in small groups. If travelling in groups please be aware that there may be lengthy queues in approach to some of the streets displaying Christmas lights.



President Phil has given himself an early Christmas surprise: 1939 DENNIS BIG 4 PUMPER AND LADDER TRUCK.

It arrived in Australia in January 1940 as an unbodied chassis with a Dennis Tamini No 3 centrifugal pump rated at 650-800 gpm; was bodied in NSWFB Workshops; and fitted with a Wormald Aer-o-foam pump in 1941.

It entered service at Waterloo between 1942 and 1956.

It then became a spare, but was noted in Newcastle between 1966 and 1970.

It was then retired from service and sold to Casula Wreckers in 1971, then "rescued" in 1972.

It has a 4 cylinder OHV motor with 120mm bore and 150mm stroke, giving a swept volume of about 6.8 litres. It develops 60bhp at 1,000rpm and maximum 95bhp.

It is 7.2m long, 2.2m wide and 2.9m high to top of the stored ladder. The ladder extends to 15m.

The truck weighs 5.8tonnes and the ladder 1.4tonnes. A crew of 6 is required to manoeuvre the ladder.

#### From the CHMC NSW General Meeting, Armidale 28/10/23

- **Pink Slips** CHMC **is not** proposing that annual pink slips be required for all HVS vehicle registration. Our adopted position **IF** TfNSW propose mandatory pink slips for HVS is:
  - For pre-1972 vehicles, clubs may use either club scrutineer inspections or AIS pink slips
  - For post-January 1st 1972 vehicles, clubs will require a pink slip for HVS (1972 the Australian Design Rules were introduced)
  - Vehicles over 4.5 t must pass a HVIS (Heavy Vehicle Inspection Scheme) "brown slip".
- 60 Day Logbook CHMC is not proposing any change. Our adopted position is:
  - That status quo for Log Books be maintained.
  - Club Runs should continue in addition to the 60 day logbook general use and maintenance.
  - **Council's CVS Policy**. In response to suggestions from our clubs, the Committee proposes that our current stance on vehicles we approve for registration under CVS be relaxed.
  - Peter Wright and Council's Registration Sub-committee will prepare a proposal on CVS revisions for clubs to consider.

**From the Dubbo TFNSW/CHMC/HMA Workshop 4/11/23** Much of the information at Dubbo our CHMC clubs were already well aware of from our previous HVS/CVS workshops and *Dinkum Oil* newsletters. However, it was another opportunity to get, or be kept, up to speed. Points for all clubs and their members to be diligent about:

- Road Safety, be aware of local and regional road toll issues and prevention strategies.
- Log books to be used for all vehicle movements <u>except</u> club organised events. Recommended to use the Log Book where there is any doubt regarding eligibility of Secondary Club event.
- Loads carried by HVS and CVS vehicles must not be for commercial purposes or work use.
- **Tractors**, there have been no changes made currently under HVS. Pink Slips are not available for tractors, process on Form 1259 as for other historic vehicles with a club inspection.
