FIRE STATION

- At least 5 Club Members have completed the Crown Reserves online site induction.
- Club has needed to obtain an ABN as the Electricity supply is to a Business Premises. This has been done and Electricity supply through Shell Energy arranged.

PAST EVENTS

SUNDAY 17th SEPTEMBER IANDRA and GRENFELL

All the best laid plans.....are subject to change for any of a number of reasons! Departure from Mouldens Hill went off OK, but first port of call was the Chrysler collection, which features a number of rare machines, which were top performers in their day.





Two side valve straight eights; a 1930 Dodge and a 1932 Chrysler. Chrysler marketed four straight eight motors from 1931, ranging from 240 c.i.d displacement up to 385, the largest producing 125 hp. The conventional (6 cyl) Chrysler products of the day made do with 217 c.i.d. producing 85 hp. The red 1970 E34 Pacer (*the first "Hemi"*) had the option of either a two barrel or four barrel carburettor. Both raced at Bathurst, but the two barrel carb vehicle finished ahead of the four barrel, because its better fuel economy resulted in one less pit stop!







Some lunched in the Main Street of Grenfell, whilst others went to Iandra and lunched there. Iandra is the name of the 13,000ha property purchased by Mr Greene in 1878. Mt Oriel is the name of the homestead. At one time, 350 men were employed on the property including 61 sharefarmers. At one time it carried 19.000 sheep and produced 10,000 tons of wheat in a year.





The house was commenced as a single storey building in 1880, but extended in the 1900's to a two storey reinforced concrete building on the original foundations.





St Saviours Church was built in 1886,

and the stables in 1908

DRIVE Lite - historic and classic



Dear car club members

Welcome to the September edition of DRIVE Lite - Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS) and Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). In this edition we've got a wrap up from our attendance at the Shannon's Classic, a reminder about attending HVS and CVS events, we also answer your questions about 'Responsible Persons,' compliance certificates, and give you an update on routine vehicle inspections that we conduct with NSW Police.

Shannon's Classic event wrap-up!

The Transport for NSW Regulatory Operations team attended the annual Council of Motor Clubs' Shannon's Sydney Classic at Eastern Creek on Sunday 20 August. They enjoyed meeting club enthusiasts at Shannon's Sydney Classic and answering their questions and concerns regarding the classic vehicle scheme.

HVS and CVS vehicles attending events

Vehicles registered in the Historic or Classic Scheme primarily are owned by enthusiasts who use and enjoy the 60-day log book scheme.

Above and beyond the log book use, or for clubs that have not opted into the log book scheme, can follow the "club run" rules.

The Transport Log Book Fact sheet provides detailed information on this topic.

From time to time, some clubs are invited to attend events from community organisations or other car clubs. The invitations from other car clubs are sometimes referred as "invitation club runs."

These invitations from community organisations or other clubs should be declared as official club events and promoted and recorded via the club's established processes.

Your questions answered:

Can a club have more than one 'Responsible Person'?

Thanks to Gundagai Antique Motor Club Inc for sending in this question. A club may have more than one 'responsible person,' to cater for workload, geographic areas etc. It is important for the Responsible Person to be well-informed about the eligibility requirements of the Historic Vehicle Scheme and to fulfill their responsibilities diligently to ensure compliance.

In signing and stamping Form 1259, the Responsible Person has declared that in physically sighting the vehicle, it can be determined that the vehicle is in a safe operating condition and is eligible for the Historic Vehicle Scheme in meeting both age and the limits of owner certified modifications.

A club may have more than one "responsible person," but the club should be ensuring that these numbers are limited, the people are well versed in terms of their obligations and that the club stamps are well managed and tracked.

The club's robust compliance regime should be detailed enough to mitigate any potential non-compliance.

Clubs are reminded that they must notify Transport for NSW on any changes to their nominated Responsible Persons. This must be sent to Accreditations ais@transport.nsw.gov.au

Do I need a Compliance Certificate for a modified vehicle?

A vehicle registered under the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS) that has undergone a significant modification requires certification. If that vehicle was certified prior to the introduction of the VSCCS (i.e., in Dec 2011) that an Engineering Certificate issued by participant of the NSW Engineering Certification Scheme is acceptable provided it addresses the modifications made to the vehicle and can be produced if requested by a Club Official or an Authorised Officer or an Authorised Person.

If the vehicle has undergone additional modifications or if that Engineering Certificate cannot be produced when requested, a Compliance Certificate issued in an approved format by a VSCCS Licensed Certifier must be obtained.

Good to know - routine compliance inspections are underway

During routine vehicle inspections, NSW Police identified 37 vehicles in the Macarthur region that may have had defects and issued the owners <u>S.66 notices</u> for the vehicles to attend for inspection.



The vehicles inspected included standard light vehicles, four-wheel drive vehicles and two vehicles that were on standard registration built in 1987 and 1991 (neither of these vehicles were part of CVS or HVS).

The routine inspection was part of the standard checking process done throughout NSW to ensure that all vehicles on the road are safe and in good working order.

There were a range of issues identified from uncertified, modified vehicles to unsafe defective vehicles. In total 37 vehicles were inspected with 33 defect notices issued. The vehicles eligible for CVS/HVS were both found to have major grounded defects (red labelled) for issues ranging from uncertified engine upgrades (turbo, air filters), exhaust systems non-compliant, window tint and suspension.

PARKES CHRISTMAS PARADE 2023 FRIDAY 1st DECEMBER



Parkes Christmas Street Parade Conditions and Guidelines 2023

- All floats must be decorated in a Christmas theme.
- All floats must be preregistered to participate in the parade.
- The maximum length of any vehicle including towed additions must not exceed
- 12.5m. Maximum height is 4.3m. Maximum width is 3.5m.
- All drivers must be appropriately licensed for the type of vehicle being driven.
- All motorcyclists are to hold a Class R license.
- Articulated vehicles are not permitted in the Street Parade. Light vehicles towing trailers are permitted.
- Official Street Parade identification to be displayed clearly.
- Float participants are not permitted to spray or squirt water or throw or handout any items during the parade.
- Smoking or the consumption of alcohol is not permitted in the parade. The Street Parade passes through an alcohol-free zone.
- Children participating in the Street Parade must be supervised by a responsible adult aged over 18.
- Floats carrying people must include a handrail or stabilising bar for the safety of the float's participants.
- All passengers including children and babies must be restrained when riding in a vehicle.
- While entrants are restricted to a <10kmh speed limit they are also required to maintain a constant speed and to not come to a stop or create excessive space between their float and the entry in front.
- All vehicles must have a nominated float supervisor and driver who will be responsible for ensuring all participants are briefed to ensure the care and control of all passengers and materials.
- Parkes Shire Council and Parkes Police reserve the right to remove any entries that are deemed unsuitable or that contravene these conditions.
- Participants are to indemnify Parkes Shire Council against any claim which may arise directly from this activity.
- Entries must be received no later than Friday 17th November 2023.
