GUIDELINES FOR CONCESSIONAL REGISTRATION (CLUB PLATES)

Member must be financial. Vehicle has to be at least thirty years old.

Vehicle must be inspected by the Club Registrar at least once each year (RMS pink slip is acceptable). Minimum insurance cover of Third Party Property Damage. Full Comprehensive is recommended, proof of cover must be provided to Registrar prior to initial registration or renewal.

RMS has introduced a 2-year Trial program to test the viability of a new category of participation.

The new program will permit the use of approved vehicles for personal purposes for 60 days in the year, in addition to attendances at authorised Club Outings.

Owners will be required to <u>maintain a Log Book</u> showing the date, time and departure location for each day that the vehicle is used. (Failure to maintain an accurate and up-to-date daily record could mean severe consequences for the member and our club!)

Eligibility of your vehicle(s) may be reconsidered if the following vehicle attendances are not met :-One Vehicle – Must attend three Club events each year.

<u>Two Vehicles</u> – One vehicle must attend one Club event & the other vehicle two Club events each year. <u>Three or more Vehicles</u> – Each vehicle must attend one Club event each year.

Any variation from these rules, for acceptable legitimate reasons, will require prior Club approval.

Non-compliance can result in registration being cancelled. The Club cannot afford the risk of the system being abused and the subsequent loss of the benefits of these worthwhile concessions for other Club members.

FIRST PRESIDENTS REPORT - SUMMERLAND SPORTS AND CLASSIC CAR CLUB

Firstly, let me say how honoured I am to have been elected as President of the Summerland Sports and Classic Car Club. As I am a "relatively" new member of the club perhaps a brief resume would be in order. I think members may know what Robyn and I look like given that we have been rather "over-exposed" in the last couple of Accelerations!

Born in Bendigo, Victoria in 1945. Completed my education in Melbourne and qualified as an Accountant. Married Robyn in 1967 and we have 3 children and 4 grand children. Our daughter Jessie is a nurse at Lismore Base Hospital, the boys live in Sydney and the Sunshine Coast.

I worked for Mount Isa Mines for 10 years, 5 years in Mount Isa and 5 in Brisbane before returning to Melbourne where I worked for 2 years with Western Mining Corporation before joining Shell Australia as Group Taxation Manager and then Group Treasurer.



Our first few years back in Australia were totally devoted to building our house and establishing the farm at Tuckombil. But then I came across an advertisement for an E Type! More to come on the Australian cars in subsequent reports.


