Rolls Royce Recollections

Prior to marriage and emigration in 1965, my wife, Judy (nee Bibby) and I, did much of our courting and post-engagement carryings-on in and around the same village of West Wittering, West Sussex as mentioned in the documentary (SBS—Secrets of the Rolls Royce). Judy's mother (nee Gillian Marigold Ramsey)'s lovely old family home was there and the Ramsey tribe owned a number of properties in the area.

This was indeed the same village that Sir Henry Royce elected to move down to towards the latter part of WW1 in 1917 and lived there until his death in 1933. Indeed he leased "The Studio" from Lillian Fairbrother Ramsey, Judy's Great Aunt (1877-1974) "Lil" where many new RR designs were drafted, having first been scratched out with a stick in the sand down at West Wittering Beach. This included the development of the famous RR Merlin series of engines which powered Britain to win the Schneider Trophy in 1929 in a Supermarine S 6B seaplane using a RR R Series engine. Held off Calshot Spit in the Solent, Wittering Beach being a rounding mark of the course. Merlin engines were also used as the power source for the Spitfire, and Hurricane fighters and the Lancaster bombers of WW2. (All the above verifiable on Google)

Judy and I spent many happy hours in West Wittering before emigrating and had the good fortune to be invited to tea at "Jonquil" her home in 1964. "Jonquil" was the oldest (thatched) cottage in the village with no modern reticulated services of any sort (like running water or electricity) - water had to be drawn up from the garden well, and oil lamps were used for lighting! Aunt Lil remained a spinster all her life and was utilised by the War Department throughout WW1 due to her useful daily weather recordings. Author of note from 1936 she wrote regular articles for the West Sussex Gazette under the guise of "Mrs Paddick".

Great Aunt 'Lil' was a leading stirrer and shaker in West Wittering in her day and today's Women's Equal Rights movement would have been proud to include her name on their register. (refer individual entry in Wikipedia). A truly remarkable woman.







Remembering When... (Part 1)

My story started during July of 1958.I was at the time working for the Service Department of H. G. Palmers in Sydney. My job was servicing electrical appliances in Parramatta and Liverpool.

One afternoon, whilst on a service all, in my service vehicle 1950 Morris "j" Van, I got lot in the outskirts of Ingleburn. After driving for some time up a dirt road, I decided to do a U Turn and head back. I nosed the van towards a fence on the side of the road and noticed in the paddock next to me, hiding amongst the high grass close to some chicken sheds was a vehicle of some sort. I though "gee that's an old car" thought no more of it and drove off.

The following weekend whilst watching a car parade at Liverpool saw some Veteran Cars pass by. I remembered the old car in the grass a few miles away and decided to investigate a bit further.

As I was peering over the fence at the car which consisted of a radiator, engine, chassis, wheels etc I noticed four more vehicles in the grass. In all they turned out to be a 1912 Russell, two 1920 Humber's and a Veteran T Ford.

Suddenly a man appeared from behind the chicken sheds and said "Can I help you?" I said "sorry, I was just looking at the old cars"

He answered "Come and have a look at the shed there are more.

It was a breathtaking scene as I walked between the Continued next month two chicken sheds. My eyes went from left to right with my jaw hanging open, firstly a 23-60 Vauxhall complete, a very big 1925 Rolls Royce sedan, another Vauxhall, a 30-98, a small Bugatti, an SS Jaguar, a1928 Chev 2-Doorsedan, and about 20 other assorted American vintage cars mostly backed the chicken shed. The gentleman's name was Ron Grant a well known figure in the Veteran Car movement in Sydney. I noticed a large four door tourer with its hood up sitting in the middle of the yard facing away from us – I said "what sort if vehicle is that

I remembered years ago my father rattling off names of Australian cars - "Summit, Roo, Southern Cross, Lincoln and Australian Six. Till then I had never seen an of these types of vehicles.

I fell in love with the Australian Six a 1918 model and before the day was out I bought it for 40 quid. It had done a little over eleven thousand miles since new so mechanically was not in too bad a condition.

Late in 1959 we moved to Lismore and the Australian Six made the trip on a car trailer behind a FX Holden Ute. The Ute towed the car and trailer which weighed a total of two and a quarter tons. It was a struggle and took 25 hours. Early in 1960 we got the big Rutenbur motor of the Australian Six to fire up and run, first time in over thirty years.

One day during 1960, I was walking around the CBD of Lismore and noticed a nice 23/60 Vauxhall parked. I waited for the owner and told him I had am Australian Six. He was Charles Purdue.

Over the next few months I visited his home often and spoke of old cars - he had a good collection of T-Fords and a big collection of parts. We discussed the possibility of starting a Vintage Car Club and during November 1960 put an advertisement in the local paper "The Northern Star" for anyone interested in starting Vintage Car Club to meet at the local Council rooms. "The Northern Rivers Vintage Car Club" was formed

Club Run Recipe

Flandango

Step 1 prepare a tart shell

Using 180grams (6 ounces) of plain crushed biscuit mix with 90g (3 ounces) melted butter

When smooth press mixture into a 9" pie plate and chill.

<u>Step 2</u> Combine 400g tin of Nestles Sweetened condensed milk, 1 x 450 can of drained golden circle crushed pineapple, $\frac{3}{4}$ cup lemon juice and teaspoon of gelatine dissolved in 2 tablespoons of water.

Step 3 pour mixture into tart shell and refrigerate until set.




