GUIDELINES FOR CONCESSIONAL REGISTRATION (CLUB PLATES)

Member must be financial. Vehicle has to be at least thirty years old.

Vehicle must be inspected by the Club Registrar at least once each year (RMS pink slip is acceptable). Minimum insurance cover of Third Party Property Damage. Full Comprehensive is recommended, proof of cover must be provided to Registrar prior to initial registration or renewal.

RMS has introduced a 2-year Trial program to test the viability of a new category of participation.

The new program will permit the use of approved vehicles for personal purposes for 60 days in the year, in addition to attendances at authorised Club Outings.

Owners will be required to <u>maintain a Log Book</u> showing the date, time and departure location for each day that the vehicle is used. (Failure to maintain an accurate and up-to-date daily record could mean severe consequences for the member and our club!)

Eligibility of your vehicle(s) may be reconsidered if the following vehicle attendances are not met :-One Vehicle – Must attend three Club events each year.

<u>Two Vehicles</u> – One vehicle must attend one Club event & the other vehicle two Club events each year. <u>Three or more Vehicles</u> – Each vehicle must attend one Club event each year.

Any variation from these rules, for acceptable legitimate reasons, will require prior Club approval.

Non-compliance can result in registration being cancelled. The Club cannot afford the risk of the system being abused and the subsequent loss of the benefits of these worthwhile concessions for other Club members.

AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL JAGUAR RALLY - 2019

My wife Robyn and I set off on a warm autumn day in our 1958 XK 150 OTS with showers threatening. We were on our way to the National Jaguar Rally to be held at the twin cities of Albury/Wodonga on the New South Wales/Victoria border, a distance of approximately 1,400kms (850 miles). Our objective on the first day was the town of Gunnedah (about 320 miles) to the west of the Great Dividing Range. We encountered a few showers of rain en route but driving conditions were ideal.

The following day was fine and cool, perfect weather for the XK as we motored down the back roads of New South Wales to the town of Forbes in the central west. Here we met up with old friends John and Liz Ledbrook who have owned their XK 150 'S' FHC for almost 50 years. John had just a week previously finished reinstalling the engine and gearbox in the car after some major work on the clutch, so we left the following morning with a degree of nervousness about the performance of his car. Apart from some oil leakage his car performed perfectly over the period of the next week.

We left Forbes at a sensible hour in the morning giving the thriving population of kangaroos plenty of time to finish their roadside breakfast and stopped at the quaint village of Grenfell where the grain silos have been painted with a wonderful rural landscape. The size of the silos is evident in the photo with the two XK's.



A further stop on the way to Albury was at the city of Wagga Wagga where we inspected the restoration of another XK 150 'S' FHC. This car is being restored from the ground up by a young fellow and it is his first XK restoration. When finished this car will be magnificent, as the attention to detail is quite extraordinary.

The weather continued to be kind for the rest of our trip into Wodonga where we checked into our hotel for the next 4 days. The following day however saw a dramatic change in the weather with storms and torrential rain and many of the Rally participants arriving that day experienced quite a drenching.

Saturday was the Concours and display day for the cars with over 160 Jaguars on show. For the first time I can remember XK's outnumbered 'E' Types with some 28 XK's of all versions on display. It's worth mentioning also that the weather change signalled a temperature drop from the mid 20'sC to around 12C for the weekend!



It was rather difficult to take a comprehensive photo of all the cars as they were spread out over a large area.

Sunday saw us taking a drive through the picturesque countryside in northern Victoria stopping at a winery for a light lunch. The Rally then concluded on Sunday evening with a presentation dinner at the Wodonga Golf Club.

Monday morning, after saying farewell to many friends, we set off accompanied by Tim and Marion Thearle in their XK 140. The return trip home was uneventful and we stopped off at Black Mountain near Guyra where Denis and Jenni Wright have a large sheep and cattle property and also an XK 140 FHC, which I had not seen before. Thearle car left, Wright car right!



All in all a great trip covering 2,900 kms (1,800 miles) in 8 days. The 150 performed faultlessly, consuming half a litre of oil and averaging just under 30 miles per gallon of fuel. For those who doubt that figure, the car has a Tremec T5 gearbox and in 5th gear at 60mph runs at 2000rpm, brilliant!




