Judging completed, the presentation was carried out in the Museum at one pm with our own **Tony Johnson's**


Austin Healey winning the trophy for the Best Imported Car. Well done Tony.

Remembering When... (Part 2)

A little over a year later after being transferred to Grafton with my employment, Sam Darke and myself started the Grafton Vintage Motor Vehicle Club.

During 1962 while in Grafton I completed an economical restoration of the Australian Six and took it to Lismore on its first outing to the Lismore Clubs' first main event, a weekend rally during the Lismore Floral Festival. It was very well patronised with a large contingent from Brisbane a good roll up for Lismore club and the Grafton Club.

I have been lucky to have got involved with the Vintage Car Movement early and have participated in a lot of international, national and State rallies in a wide range of Vintage and Classic Cars.

From a tiny 1927 Austin 7 to a two and a half ton 1958 Studebaker President 7 passenger sedan, rare cars like the 1918 Australian Six, and 1923 Summit Roadster (one of only five made in Sydney), later model classics 1965 Mustang, 1983 Chev Camaro, 1978 MGBGT, also cars made for the masses, 1925 T-Ford, 192 Morris Cowley, 1928 Graham Paige, 1938 McLaughlin Buick.

My possessions of cars I have owned seem to be white elephants, lame ducks or oddballs including the Leyland P76 sedan. Two motorcycles have been part of my collection, a 1914 Triumph 2 stroke with gas headlights on which I got my motorcycle license and a 1952 Vincent Twin which was a pure classical beast to ride.

Clubs I have belonged to the years were: Northern Rivers Vintage and Veteran Car Club, Grafton Vintage Motor Vehicle Club (Life Member), The Buick Car Club of Queensland, QVVA (Brisbane), Austin Seven Register (Qld), Morris Minor Club (Qld), Leyland P76 Club (Australia)/ Positions I have held in Clubs are President (four terms), treasurer, rally director, magazine editor, and have made many friends over the years.

All the cars that I have restored over the past forty years have all had their challenges to me. My favourite restoration would be the 1923 Summit Roadster with its unusual spring system.

Within the last ten years Sharon and I have been fairly quiet in the old car movement and have only had a 1917 Dodge Roadster, a 1975 MGBGT, a 1969 Rover P5 sedan, with my last effort being a 2001 Rover 75 connoisseur sedan.





No entry fee, no maps!


Starting at the Club Grounds at Jabour Park at 10am, cars will be set off with simple navigation instructions to guide them to Shannon Creek Dam...the long way round.

Plans are under way for this return tour of Tassie, the first one was our maiden tour in 2011.

The first stop will be Goulburn on the 19th March 2020. 
