

Under the current rules of the 60-day log books owners have relative freedom to use their vehicles as they choose. The scheme is intended to provide owners with the opportunity to enjoy greater use of their vehicles. While the HVS and CVS are not intended as cheap forms of registration for vehicles to be used as daily drivers, there is no specific ban on the use of the log books for trips that could include a visit to a shop or workplace.

The exact wording on the RMS website says: "The log book trial will allow classic vehicles to be used for 60 days of general use (ie maintenance and personal use) each year, outside of club organised events."

Two major insurance companies have differing views on the extent of their comprehensive cover on vehicles using their 60-day log book entitlement.

Shannons accept that vehicles are covered as long as they are being used in accordance with the conditions of their registration scheme and log book. On that basis a vehicle using its log book entry would be covered even if commuting to work or shops.

However, a Comprehensive insurance policy with NRMA does not cover historic vehicles (HVS or CVS) when they are being used to commute to work or shops.

Those insuring their historic vehicles with NRMA should be made aware of this exclusion.




