COFFEE RUN TO WOOLGOOLGA AND BRINDLEYS NURSERY 29TH JUNE 2019

What a beautiful Saturday morning after rain overnight.

The morning started at 8.45am at Repco. We proceeded up the highway to Woolgoolga, for morning coffee at Anchors Kitchen. An array of food, coffee and tea was consumed. We were allocated a section of the restaurant to cater for 40 people. The staff did a magic job in preparing bacon & egg rolls, muffins, toast etc. At 10.00am we travelled some 10 minutes to Brindley's Nursery in Sandy Beach.

On arrival we had a group photo before splitting into 2 groups for a guided tour of the Wholesale Nursery. Our tour guides were Graeme Brindley and Graeme Bassett.

What an eye opener it was!

For 2 hours we walked around the nursery with a running commentary on the history of Brindley's and also on plant types and their origin and history. To name a few surprises, some plants imported from China, hot water pumped around the gardens, temperature controlled hot houses, grey water used from Coffs Harbour Council, automatic potting machine, temperature-controlled louvres, tagging and barcoding of every plant that leaves the nursery.

This technology is vital in the production of high-quality indoor plants which are sold to major retail outlets like Bunning, Big W etc.

This was a very informative morning and we were extremely lucky to have the opportunity to visit.


The simpler option is to simply fill out your logbook (after all the majority of us do not use 60 days), which takes out any doubt that you are complying with the logbook trial regulations.
