The Club cannot afford the risk of the system being abused and the subsequent loss of the benefits of these worthwhile concessions for other Club members.



Early Days of Aviation

in Lismore

The official opening of Lismore Airport has brought to light historical photographs of the early days of aviation in Lismore.

Included was this photograph from the albums of Mr A.R Dawes of Eltham. Taken in the early 1920's it shows one of the first planes to land at Lismore. The aircraft, an Avro piloted by Captain Percival, landed in a paddock on the Wyrallah road near where the squash courts are now located. The propeller was damaged by tall growing paspalum in the paddock which extended in front of St. Vincent's Hospital

BURRELL STEAM ENGINE

Manufactured by Noel Gill & Gordon Lowrey

The design originated from the Burrell Engine Manufacturing Co. in England. Gordon Lowrey who had dreamed of owning one of these engines, with Noel Gill, approached Col Grieve of Casino, who had built one of the engines, drew a set of plans for them to work to. Six years in the making and with Col's advice along the way everything began to take shape. However approximately 12 months ago Col Grieve passed away so the rest of the manufacturing process was left to working to plans and their engineering capability.

At last, after many hours of trial and era, and powering with compressed air, they had all levers & linkages operating as designed. The machine was to be displayed in Casino at the Heritage Horse Power weekend. The boiler was passed for inspection the day before.


He started to build it in 1901 from plans he got from England and had it running in late 1902. I went down with him in 1903 to run electors to the pole for A&E Palmer, a flour miller from Euroa, who was the first Federal member for Echuca or Rodney Electorate and a personal friend of Grandpa.

Mr Palmer at that time had a Stanley steam car. Grandpa's car had a plate on the driver's side; Earnshaw Owner & Maker, Echuca. It was a single cylinder engine with coil ignition, powered by dry cells. It had a commutator similar to the ignition on a Model T Ford. I had a spare commutator in my possession for some time, but lost it.

After a period of time Grandpa built a Two Cylinder engine and put it in the car which was a four seat. I think George Judge has a photograph of it. I believe the car was sold to a station owner up near Hay, NSW. He afterwards had a Briscoe car (American) the agency for which was in Brisbane. This car he gave to Eric & Pearl.

Grandpa always said that there were only two kinds of people who should own motor cars, 'Millionaire's and damn fools.'

Grandpa also had an T.W.G motor bike for a while.






