
Sunday December 8th


Dunedoo hosted its annual Tunes on the Turf music festival on the weekend, and the showground was chockers with campers. Obviously bought some money into the town.

You Went There In That

When you drive a Suzuki carry ute with a tiny slide on camper on the back the most frequent comments you receive are, is it a sandwich van - do you sell fish - looks like an esky good around town ute - nice ladies ute - or just that funny utie thingy. The comment that stands out the most is - you went there in that. While crossing the Derwent river bridge in Hobart I was told by a Jaguar driver to 'get a decent car'. So naive. These comments don't really bother me, at least they have seen me and just make me more determined to show that you don't need three tonnes of steel with huge tyres, winches, lights that melt bitumen two kilometers away, every piece of recovery gear that a sales person can possibly sell you, high lift suspension, and who knows what else just to get around Australia and even to some of the more challenging places. Yes how about Cape York, Steep Point, Great Central Road, Mt.Sheiler, Great Sandy Desert, Lake Ayre and the list goes on. Yes I have been stuck twice so far, once in the great sandy desert and once on rainbow beach when I stopped to help a normal 4x4 who was bogged. Got him out and then he pissed off without a word of thanks or help for me.

The trip to Cape York was the first big one. I managed to obtain advice from several trusted people who unfortunately mostly said don't do it in that. Being someone who likes to prove a point I set out regardless. The trip was great up through central Queensland via Gregory Downs, Lawn Hill, Burketown, Normanton, Croyden, Chillagoe, Laura, Bamaga. I chose to use the development track to Cape York instead of the renowned telegraph track.

The Telegraph Track is considered one of the ultimate 4x4 challenges. Sometimes I do know where not to venture. I did on one occasion deviate to the telegraph track and met up with some "proper 4x4" that were attempting to destroy themselves by travelling through sections where it was totally unnecessary to do so. One section they bashed through a metre of water over rocks the size of footballs while I carefully drove around the edge in about 100mm of water. This was in the area of fruit bat falls.

I camped at Morton Telegraph Station and as usual the ute and the camper did not go unnoticed along with one of my small gas bottle camp fires. At the time this meant nothing but was to my savior on the return trip. The remaining trip north was uneventful except that my choice of roads may have avoided some extreme 4x4 work but not the thousands and thousands of large corrugates. 13 inch wheels and corrugates do not mix.

Many hours were spent in second gear at less than 20kph. I assisted a near new Nissan 4x4 with a blown turbo and saw him on his way behind a local Toyota workmate ute loaded with king prawns back towards Cairns. I later heard his repair bill was in excess of \$5,000.00 (just out of warranty). This guy had followed me on a previous day through an area called palm hill just in case I ran into trouble. Ha ha. The rest of the trip north, although interesting, was uneventful. Once at Cape York I carefully parked the ute (illegally) on the beach a few hundred metres short of the very tip. I took the mandatory photos and headed back. Just north of the Moreton Telegraph Station the fun began.

Firstly, I sheered off one shock absorber which made driving on extreme corrugates very interesting, on several occasions ending up facing the wrong way. Things did improve when the second shock broke off, at least it stayed a little bit straighter at this point provided you were under 20kph. The shocks were the only after market modification on the ute. I returned to Moreton Station where after convincing the owner I had a reasonable idea of workshop repairs he allowed me to use his workshop on the condition I allowed no one else in. Unknowingly I unloaded one of the workman from the station before he could prove who he was.

I made the necessary repairs in what was a very basic workshop and then commenced to thoroughly clean the shop, sharpen all drills and make the place as tidy as I could. The owner came to visit when I finished and was astounded. I asked him how much for the use of the shop expecting him to say at least \$250.00 but would not have been surprised at \$500.00. However, he said stay the night and we will see you tomorrow. The next morning I approached him and he said I would have to pay the camping fees of about \$20.00 as he was only the manager but for the use of the workshop he said he would exchange this for my small fire place. The fire place cost me about \$15.00 to make. So you can see I was very happy and it shows doing the right thing pays off. I was invited back whenever it suited me.

An alternative to return from Cape York to Cairns was via a barge which was definitely recommended however, I found the booking of this barge, from the northern end was impossible and after the visit to the guys workshop, maybe I had a better experience returning the overland way.

It took several more weeks via eastern Queensland to return to Grafton, a low point being at a Bundaburg camping area where some scumbag pinched my tea towel. Not bad for this to be the lowest point. Ha ha.

After two months I was back home, the little utie thingy looked a bit worst for the wear but had many more similar trips ahead of it.




