
Recognised as one of the world's largest historic motor racing events on the international calendar, by the number of entries and races held over the three days, the Phillip Island Classic promoted by the Victorian Historic Road Racing Register once again drew more than 500 entries with vehicles from around the world gridding up. Our Mid North Coast was well represented once again by our intrepid club members, Dick Willis and Mike Gosbell.

Dick driving his much travelled 1960 Nota Major (64) and Mike his unique 1957 Sabakat Lotus 12 (121) - both were entered in the fiercely contested Lb. Racing and Sports Cars 1941 – 1960 Class.

Both shared some good news and not so good news as the weekend progressed.

As Dick recounted, "Qualifying, seeded 17th out of 40, they didn't have much faith in the Nota's ability as it had finished in the top six at PI in the past two years. Track was half damp so I spent the first two laps trying to determine where it was safe to have a go but then it was red flagged because of an accident so we were to grid at number 13 for the first race.

Friday race, passed a few at the start and was looking good but another accident and another red flag after just two laps so it was declared a no race.



Saturday AM race, started 13th, another good start and made some progress to finish 7<sup>th</sup> but some problems were starting to show themselves, top speed seemed to be down about 10 kph to 180 compared to previous years, lap times were 3 seconds slower than my previous best.

Saturday PM race, started 7<sup>th</sup>, should have been a good start but someone chopped in front of me, got up to 6th which was about as good as it was going to get, had to pull out with a lap to go when the temp gauge got into the danger zone and it started to misfire. Trying to find the cause of the misfiring, found the distributor balance weights had come loose and it was advancing the spark too much, did a temporary fix.



Sunday AM race, rear of grid start because of previous DNF, had a bit of trouble getting past tailenders who were engaged in their own race but then it overheated again so another DNF, time to call it a day and head for home.

At home in the cool light of day and time to think, pulled the motor out to get the clutch balanced which was suspected of causing a vibration, removed the cylinder head and found a slight blow in the head gasket in the middle two cylinders which probably explains the coolant loss. Found the clutch driven plate

cracked so avoided a future disaster there and we have yet to repair the distributor."

Mike had an enjoyable weekend with plenty of track time before misfortune struck.

During the last run exiting Swan Corner onto the extremely fast Gardner Straight, the gearbox started making unusual and expensive sounds. He managed to coast the length of the famous straight to find a safe exit point that would lead him back to the pits. It was then loaded onto the trailer for the long trip home. A very knowledgeable engineer and a highly experienced welder have since been engaged to reconstruct the 'one of a kind' gearbox – a feat in itself.

Car 121 is one of only twelve ever made with its unique history having been well documented in previous editions of our Idle Torque Magazine. It is well worth another read. A lot of jobs for both stalwarts to do prior to hitting the tracks once again, As they say, "that's motorsport".



Well done Dick and Mike - keep the flag flying and those wheels turning.

For seasoned followers of Australian Motorsport, seeing such legends as Larry Perkins (Patron of the meeting), Kevin Bartlett, Alan Moffatt and Fred Gibson amongst others being surrounded by admirers throughout the weekend was amazing.

If you have never been to this event and appreciate watching some of the best classic racing cars in action, then consider heading to arguably the world's most picturesque racetrack that is Phillip Island.

You will not be disappointed.

From enjoying the rare opportunities to talk to the drivers to hearing those engines being tuned then at 'full song' on the track makes the long journey to Phillip Island almost addictive.





Members with multiple H/D plated cars may attend the five (5) runs in any of their H/D plated vehicles. New members must attend four (4) club runs or club events before applications for H/D plates will be considered for approval by C.ex Coffs Sports, Touring & Classic Car Club.

#### **Invitation Events:**

NB These events are not organised through the clubs Events Committee but are recognised as official club runs. Members attending these events in H/D registered vehicles do not need their logbooks filled out **but** do require proof that they are attending an official "invitation club event". This can be done by carrying a hard copy of the event advertised in Idle Torque or an electronic copy on a device. The simpler option is to simply fill out your logbook (after all the majority of us do not use 60 days), which takes out any doubt that you are complying with the logbook trial regulations.


