

The following notice was posted on the Advanced Motoring Group Coffs Harbour Facebook site by Stewtart Copeland on 6th July 2020


Hi everyone,

I don't want to alarm any of my friends in the car scene but I have just found out about a very unpleasant incident that happened this afternoon where a group of motorists in Coffs Harbour tried to trap an enthusiast out for a relaxing drive with his wife in his XY Falcon and when he drove away from them, they chased him and tried to force him to pull over. This was an extremely scary incident and certainly not someone being paranoid as there were three vehicles chasing him (a bright yellow Ford Ranger ute with black side panelling like in the photo, a scruffy maroon Nissan Patrol chopped into a ute - with a quad bike on the back - and a Harley Davidson motorbike) and the Harley rider even left the road and tried to ride up the footpath to block the person in the XY. Thank goodness, he managed to get away from his pursuers and once he was sure that they were not following him, he reported it to the police. The police are very concerned and feel sure that this group are involved in a car-jacking operation up and down the coast and will possibly move onto another location shortly however it is very likely that they have and will be on the lookout for any other possible targets ... SO PLEASE BE VERY CAREFUL. Whilst a yellow Ranger does stand out, it is uncommon and the police stated that they believe that the car has possibly been stolen and repainted and won't be around for long before they move on. PLEASE don't panic but do be careful. THIS IS NOT A HOAX AND I AM NOT TRYING TO SCARE MY FRIENDS BUT THIS POST IS TO PROTECT AND GUARD YOUR PERSONAL SAFETY.

Having seen Leo's pic with the "Grey Ghost" in one of the final issues of the Coffs Coast Advocate reminded me that the "Grey Ghost," winner of the 1954 15,000 km REDEX round Australia trial was not just any old Ford V8 sedan. It was a carefully selected 1948 model, distinguishable by it's round front park lights as against the higher mounted rectangular units of the 1946/7 series. However the main reason Jack Murray selected this car was because it was a Canadian built car which featured French Houdaille shock absorbers, a circular drum shaped device actuated by a lever as opposed to the more popular telescopic shocks used on most other cars in the trial. Jack Murray knew these would withstand the rigours of this lengthy event over mostly unpaved roads and this, coupled with his driving and his navigator's skills, proved to be a winning combination.

The Ford survives to this day and Leo, himself a veteran of two of the 1950's round Australia trials, was pleased to be reunited with the 'grey Ghost' when it was featured here in Coffs a few years ago at the time of one of the rounds of the World Rally Championship.


